- How many courses can you study?
- You will be allowed to add or drop modules when you arrive at QMUL during the first two weeks of term. You are strongly advised to only use the Add/Drop period to drop modules. Adding modules after teaching has started is much more difficult, especially as you will not be used to British methods of teaching and learning. You can, therefore, register for five (or occasionally six) modules to start with, and drop one (or two, as appropriate) by the end of the Add/Drop period.

VII. Accommodation

Queen Mary offers a variety of student housing on our Mile End campus. Once you have firmly accepted an offer to study at Queen Mary you will be invited to apply for housing. The deadline to submit an application will be included in your invitation and this is submitted online. Application deadlines are usually end of May for the autumn semester and November for the spring semester*

VIII. Visa Information

Your visa requirements will vary according to your country of citizenship.

Depending on how long you will study at Northumbria you may require one of two documents a Tier 4 if you are studying for the full year the team will produce a CAS letter for you. If, however, you will study for one semester only then you can request a confirmation letter to help support your application for a Short-Term Study Visa.

One semester only

Please note that in accordance with the conditions of the permission granted under short-term study, you will be required to leave the UK within 30 days of the end of the course or at the end of 6 months, whichever is earliest.

- Full year study (more than 6 months)

If you are attending the programme for the full academic year, you will need to apply for a Tier 4 student visa. Students must apply for this visa, and obtain their entry permit, prior to travelling to the UK.
