I. About St Anne's College

Founded in 1879, St Anne's College is one of the constituent colleges of the University of Oxford in England. Formerly a women's college, it has been coeducational since 1979. Formed to enable women from any financial background to study at Oxford, St Anne's continues to strive towards this goal. The college has around 450 undergraduate and 200 graduate students.

II. About the Study Abroad Programme

As a registered Visiting Student, you become a member of the Oxford college. The college will provide a transcript for credit purposes at the home institution. If necessary, the University would be able to confirm that you were listed on the Register as a Visiting Student.

III. How to Apply

- The Oxford Academic Year Michaelmas, Hilary and Trinity terms (October June);
- The Extended Oxford Academic Year September plus Michaelmas, Hilary and Trinity terms (September June);
- Fall Term September plus Michaelmas (September December);
- Michaelmas Term only (October December);
- Hilary AND Trinity Terms only (January June).
- Requirements

If you wish to apply for St Anne's College visiting student placement you should:

- have a minimum G.P.A of 3.70 (out of 4.0) or equivalent;
- have an appropriate English Language qualification;
- IELTS Minimum 7.0 with a min of 6.5 in each component.

Qualifications must be taken within two years of the start of the academic programme.

Please submit your application form and all your supporting documents as a single Word, or PDF, document to partnerships@maxer.co.uk by 5.00pm GMT on 1 January, 2020.

- Application supporting documents

Visiting students' applications must include the following documents:

- Colour copy/ scan of the photo page of your passport;
- Academic statement;

- Transcript or other official detailed record of education;
- Two academic written work;
- Two academic references;
- Evidence of proficiency in English.

- Philosophy, Politics and Economics (PPE) visiting students can study all 3 subjects if they attend for the academic year or the extended academic year. If attending for a term it is only possible to study 2 of the 3 subjects.

In order to study joint subjects, a visiting student needs to be studying both subjects at their home institution already. It is possible you may only be offered a place to study one subject, rather than both, if you are not deemed to have sufficient background in both subjects.

VII. Accommodation

St Anne's has an excellent range of College accommodation and can offer on-site accommodation to undergraduate students for at least three years of their degrees. All of St Anne's undergraduate study-bedrooms are single occupancy and vary from characterful Victorian to bright and contemporary. Students live with others from their year group, with rooms allocated by a ballot each year. All accommodation includes kitchens, which are shared by approximately 9 students, and almost half of our rooms are en-suite.

VIII. Visa Information

Your visa requirements will vary according to your country of citizenship.

Depending on how long you will study at Northumbria you may require one of two documents a Tier 4 if you are studying for the full year the team will produce a CAS letter for you. If however, you will study for one semester only then you can request a confirmation letter to help support your application for a Short Term Study Visa.

- One semester only

Please note that in accordance with the conditions of the permission granted under short-term study, you will be required to leave the UK within 30 days of the end of the course or at the end of 6 months, whichever is earliest.

- Full year study (more than 6 months)

If you are attending the programme for the full academic year, you will need to apply for a Tier 4 student visa. Students must apply for this visa, and obtain their entry permit, prior to travelling to the UK.
